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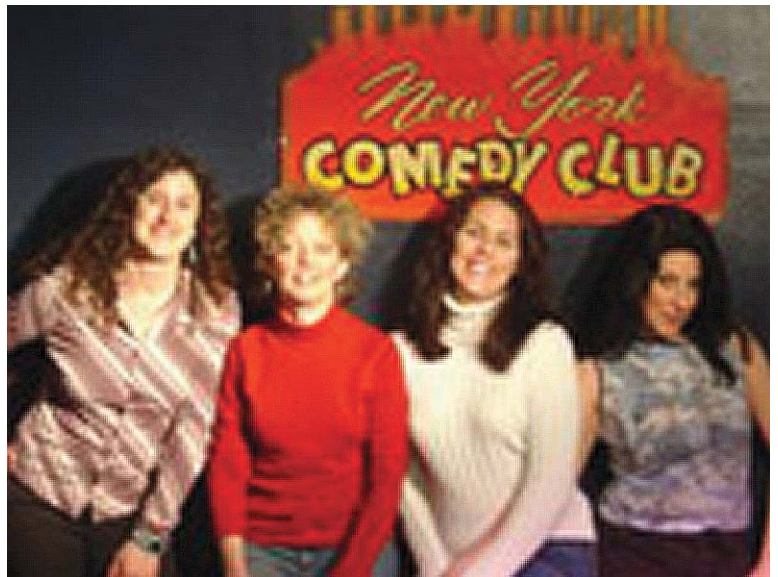

# ***A Night of 50 Tits***

Putting to rest the myth that women “just aren’t funny,” A Night of 50 Tits, recently renamed Great Sets, brought its bevy of talented female comics to an impressive Tuesday night crowd at The New York Comedy Club.

Formerly housed in the basement of Siberia Bar, 50 Tits is now bigger and better than ever before. Being a bit of a math whiz, I hunkered down for a marathon of 25 women, and I admit I was relieved when the program revealed there would only be 14 pairs taking the stage, including those belonging to



talented emcee [and former 2DM columnist] Leanna Conley. Conley’s charisma and energy are mesmerizing, and there was clearly a positive and sisterly vibe as she introduced every performer. Each was funnier than the last, and it was hard not to be impressed simply by the collection of funny women in the room.

Women who talk about their boyfriends or their ankle-biters are a dime a dozen, and they are mostly responsible for giving female comedians a bad rap. Even the funniest can fall prey to the tired topics of lazy men, controlling mothers and insolent children. Thank goodness for Joh Briley. Her memorable act centers around the New York City subway system, a common frustration and a surprisingly hilarious source for jokes. Melanie Klein’s spunk is likewise engrossingly funny, her energy barely (and sometimes not at all) able to be contained.
